The display to reflect the Show theme 'MAKE, DO, MEND'

To be arranged on a 20"/50cm covered round base (to be supplied by exhibitors).

- Accessories may be used as part of the display.
- Staging and interpretation will be judged.
- List of items to be judged must be displayed by each exhibit including recipe for cookery or preserve item.
- Each WI will be given a time slot of 30 mins to set up their exhibit at the Show.
- At least 2 members of a WI must contribute to the exhibit.

#### **USEFUL INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE FOR EXHIBITORS**

#### **CO-OPERATIVE CLASSES**

Please refer to the 2021 NFWI "**On With the Show"** (<u>see the OWTS document here</u>) Pages 54-56, 114 & 130-131 regarding both Co-operative classes.

Co-operative exhibits require teamwork between members with many differing skills. Creating a co-operative exhibit can be hard work but most of all, it is about having fun.

The theme should be visually obvious, with immediate impact and have a strong focal point. Items should be in proportion with each other and the total display space. Any accessories used should complement the items to be judged. Ensure that the display enhances all the items to be judged to advantage and that there is a balance between shapes and spaces using a variety of heights and levels.

Each exhibit is marked for staging and interpretation on its own merit and not in competition with other entries.

The judge's steward will check that all measurements are correct and the exact number and categories of items are exhibited.



#### **CRAFT CLASSES**

All crafts are judged on their merit – not against any other entry in the class. Choose colours with care. Give special attention to finishes, especially seams. Give yourself enough time to complete work as this is very often the reason for lost marks.

#### **COOKERY/PRESERVES CLASSES**

All cookery and preserves will be tasted and judged as detailed in the 2021 NFWI "On With The Show" (see the OWTS document here) Refer to Pages 106 to 149.

#### ALL EXHIBITS

#### Exhibitors may only enter one exhibit per class.

Try out new recipes and practice your entries for the show well in advance. Consult the show schedule thoroughly regarding the details of the items that you will be exhibiting.

When transporting to the Show, place all items securely in suitable packaging so that they arrive safely:

- Textiles should be rolled rather than folded.
- Slide a folded length of greaseproof paper under food items to facilitate removal from the container.

#### **OPEN CLASSES:**

Entries are invited from any WI or non-WI exhibitors.

#### **STAGING EXHIBITS**

All exhibits must be brought to the showground on Sat. 24<sup>th</sup> August 2024 between 8.30 am and 10.30 am except for the Co-operative entries (see below) and the Gordon Ramsay preserves entries (details to be provided).

On arrival please check with a member of the committee where to place your item for judging.

#### **CO-OPERATIVE EXHIBITS**

- Set up on Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> August.
- The allotted set-up time is 30 minutes for each class.
- Each WI will be notified in advance of their allocated time slot.
- Only two members to set up the exhibit.

#### WINNING EXHIBITS

All prize monies will be paid by Bank Transfer. A member of the E&O Committee will contact prize winners to obtain their bank details.

#### **PEOPLE'S CHOICE**

There will be three classes for visitors to vote for their favourite. The winners will receive a certificate and prize.

#### AT THE END OF THE SHOW

All exhibits are to be removed at 5pm on Monday 26<sup>th</sup> August 2024. It will be the responsibility of each exhibitor to make arrangements for the collection of their exhibit(s), together with the judges' comment cards.

#### Any uncollected exhibit will be disposed of by the Show committee.
