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PROGRAMME PLANNING

We encourage WIs to plan a varied and exciting programme for their members. This is best achieved if you find a way to get your members to tell you what they would like at the monthly meetings. This can be done by asking them for suggestions in a variety of ways and then booking a wide range of their ideas. Use the aims and objects of the WI as a guide to the full range of areas your meetings should cover. Most WIs have a range of extra activities on offer for members to join in with and members can join with the Federation and National events put on for them. The speakers in the Speaker Listing have all passed the Federation auditioning process and cover a wide, varied range of subjects.

THE SPEAKER

BOOKING THE SPEAKER:

After initial contact (by phone, email or post) it is a good idea to confirm in writing (email or letter) the exact details of the booking and the meeting they are to attend. This should include time, place, fee and add that they should bring whatever equipment they need to give their talk, demonstration or entertainment. If you are able to provide any amenities i.e. stage, screen, extension cable, blank wall, table/chair, make sure the speaker is aware of this on the form and ask for confirmation of what they would like provided. Speaker's fees and mileage are correct for the year in which the Speaker Listing is produced.

BEFORE THE MEETING:

Remember to confirm in the month before your meeting that the speaker is coming, and all the necessary arrangements are in place. Check again that they will be bringing all the equipment they need to give their talk, demonstration or entertainment as per your booking form.

LOOKING AFTER THE SPEAKER:

Please factor this into your meeting planning. Check requirements such as parking/ public transport/ timings/ payment etc. and ensure a member is assigned to look after the speaker for the entire time they are at your meeting.

AFTER THE MEETING:

The only way we can monitor the quality of our speakers is by WIs submitting a confidential report about the speaker after their meeting. Encourage members to participate in Group, Federation and National events by including details on your printed programme.
